Team Kansas Wins Midwest Cup

ST. JOSEPH. MISSOURI | Team Kansas eked out a slim victory at the Midwest Cup, slipping past defending champion Missouri, 301 to 300, at St. Joseph Country Club. Kansas placed two players in the top 10 and six in the top 20 of this annual team competition played by 80 competitors from 10 Midwestern states.

Minnesota's Mike Fiedler took individual honors, shooting 1-underpar 212 to win by a shot ahead of four players. Fiedler came from four shots back after two rounds and was the only player to finish in red numbers. Two-time defending individual champion Brad Nurski finished T6, two shots off the pace. First- and secondround leader Kyle Nathan struggled to a 75 in the final round and finished in the group that finished T2. RESULTS

ZALATORIS CLAIMS SECOND SUMMER TITLE

Rising Wake Forest junior Will Zalatoris won his second big amateur event of the summer, taking the Pacific Coast Amateur after a twohole playoff with Nahum Mendoza. Both players shot 3-under-par 285 at Seattle Golf Club.

Zalatoris, victorious at the Trans-Mississippi Amateur in July, scrambled to make the playoff after falling one behind Mendoza with two holes left. Zalatoris made a clutch par on 17 and followed it up with an up-anddown birdie from 60 yards

to post his 3-under total.

Waiting at the scoring table, Zalatoris didn't see Mendoza short side himself into a greenside bunker on his approach shot at the last; Mendoza failed to get up and down for birdie, resulting in extra holes.

After both competitors made pars on the first playoff hole, Zalatoris tapped in for par after a great approach on the second extra hole.

Mendoza could not get up and down from behind the green, allowing Zalatoris to join a prestigious list of past champions to hoist the Dr. Ed Updegraff trophy.

NAUMEC WINS OUIMET MEMORIAL

Matt Naumec made a downhill 20-footer for birdie on the 16th hole to break open a seesaw final round



and went on to a three-shot victory in the Francis Ouimet Memorial Tournament. The Boston College sophomore drained the double-breaker as Doug Clapp and Jacob Leavitt both made bogeys, resulting in a two-shot swing. Naumec finished with a 1-over-par 73 and a 6-under 209 total in the prestigious New England-area amateur invitational event played at three different courses. The final round was played at its traditional site, Woodland Golf Club, Ouimet's home course outside Boston. The first two rounds were played at Hyannisport Club and Oyster Harbors Club on Cape Cod.

Naumec, who started the day with a three-shot lead, had also held the lead going into the final round of the 2015 Ouimet, but fell to second when Peter French birdied eight of the last 10 holes. This time Naumec was not to be denied. Clapp, Leavitt, Ryan Tombs and Damon Salo all tied for second at 212.

In the Eddie Lowery Senior Division, Joe Walker also showed he could make up for past failure as he closed with a 75 for a 219 total and a three-shot victory ahead of Dave Houghton. Like Naumec, Walker led going into the final round in 2015 only to lose to close friend Kevin Carey.

University of Virginia-bound Julia Ford survived a three-hole playoff to win the Women's Division, adding to the title she also took in 2014.
